Hello! My name is Kateryna Petrenko, I am a 4th year student of the School of Economics, Department of Marketing, Management and Entrepreneurship, studying Information Marketing, Advertising and Public Relations. Students of the School of Economics have the opportunity to participate in international mobility programmes, which involve exchange studies at foreign universities. And I was able to take advantage of this.

During the autumn semester of 2023/2024, I studied at the Vienna University of Economics and Business (Wirtschaftsuniversität Wien) in the Austrian capital, Vienna. This higher education institution is one of the top 20 economic universities in Europe. A striking characteristic of this university is its modern campus, which was built by architects from all over the world. For example, the building of the central library, which looks like a spaceship, is a business card. The campus also has a number of research institutes, specialised and classical libraries, a beautiful green area, dining rooms, cafeterias, shops and a sports complex with three gyms.

The university has about 24,000 students, 23% of whom are international students. The university also has many partners, so every semester it hosts students from all over the world. The training was very practically oriented and interactive: work on real cases, presentations based on the results of students' own developments, and speeches by speakers from top companies. It is worth noting that almost all courses require group work, which prepares students for teamwork in real life. It's very convenient that you can choose the subjects, their number, and make a schedule at your own discretion. I studied such subjects as Fashion Marketing, Global Branding, Social Media Strategy, HRM and German. Summing up my study experience, I can say that I not only gained new knowledge, but also applied and consolidated the skills I had acquired at my native Karazin University, making me a worthy competitor to students from other foreign educational institutions.

For me, a significant difference between education at the Vienna University of Economics and Business was the seminar format: no more than 25-30 students in a class, no lectures with notes, each professor's story is accompanied by a presentation and is reinforced by a discussion with students. Since I am used to working independently, the group work that was an integral part of the curriculum was a challenge for me. However, it improved my skills in delegating work, cross-cultural communication, conflict resolution and compromise. Moreover, it gave me the opportunity to get to know the international students, who turned out to be interesting and ambitious young people.

Undoubtedly, participation in academic exchange programmes is a significant advantage that increases the competitive ability of a student participating in the programme in the labour market. This is an incredibly valuable experience, so I am grateful to the School of Economics of Karazin University, the Ukraine Special Exchange programme and the Vienna University of Economics and Business for this opportunity!
